Public comments:

Noel Cummings of Ward 6 said she is a victim of fraud and asked council to look into the matter.

Isaiah Dixon said he is experiencing homelessness and asked council for assistance. Council President Griffin asked if Dixon could stick around after the council meeting and asked people in the chambers to help Dixon any way they can.

Presentations:

Council Member Kris Harsh spoke about the partial eclipse that will take place on Oct. 14, 2023. The City of Cleveland wants to raise awareness of the full eclipse next spring on April 8, 2024. Harsh declared "April 8, 2024 – CLE-clipse Day."

Council voted to pass those two emergency ordinances.

Britt also read first-reading <u>resolutions</u> to be passed: <u>1162-2023</u> and <u>1163-2023</u>. Council passed them.
